HILLARY CLINTON'S RECORD ON LIFE

ENDORSEMENTS

Clinton is endorsed by Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion provider. Planned Parenthood said their organization plans to spend \$20 million in the election helping elect Clinton and other candidates who support abortion.

ROE V. WADE AND THE SUPREME COURT

At a town hall debate in New Hampshire on February 3, 2016, Clinton said every judicial appointment she would make must support abortion: "We've got to make sure to preserve Roe v. Wade, not let it be nibbled away or repealed."

U.S. SENATE VOTING RECORD

Clinton served as the U.S. Senator from New York from January 3, 2001 to January 21, 2009. Clinton has a lifetime prolife voting record of zero percent, as scored by the National Right to Life Committee.

OPINION OF THOSE WITH PROLIFE BELIEFS

At a campaign event in Ohio on August 27, 2015, Clinton compared her Republican presidential opponents to terrorists for their prolife policy views: "Now, extreme views about women, we expect that from some of the terrorist groups, we expect that from people who don't want to live in the modern world, but it's a little hard to take from Republicans who want to be the president of the United States."

UNBORN VICTIMS OF VIOLENCE

In 2004 Senator Clinton voted against the Unborn Victims of Violence Act, which provides legal recognition for unborn children harmed as a result of criminal action. The law is often called Laci and Conner's Law, in honor of murder victims Laci Peterson and her unborn son Conner.

LATE-TERM ABORTIONS

Clinton supports abortion being legal up until the moment of birth. On MSNBC's "Meet the Press Daily" on September 28, 2015, Clinton said, "There can be restrictions in the very end of the third trimester, but they have to take into account the life and health of the mother."

PARTIAL-BIRTH ABORTION

Senator Clinton voted against the Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act of 2003, and has expressed support for her husband's veto of bills to ban partial-birth abortion in 1995 and 1997.

TAXPAYER FUNDING OF ABORTIONS

While accepting Planned Parenthood's endorsement at a New Hampshire rally on January 10, 2016, Clinton called for repealing the Hyde Amendment. The Hyde Amendment prevents federal tax-funding of abortion and has been in place since 1976.

INTERNATIONAL ABORTION ADVOCACY

In 2009, President Obama ordered U.S. funding of private organizations that perform and promote abortion overseas. Serving as his Secretary of State, Clinton told Congress that the Administration would advocate globally that "reproductive health includes access to abortion."
