VIEWS ON ABORTION

DONALD TRUMP'S views on abortion changed after seeing close friends experience a crisis pregnancy and keep their child:

"The next president must follow those principles that work best and that reinforce the reverence Americans hold for life. A culture of life is too important to let slip away for convenience or political correctness." **HILLARY CLINTON** served as the U.S. Senator from New York from January 3, 2001 to January 21, 2009. Clinton has a lifetime prolife voting record of 0 percent, as scored by the National Right to Life Committee. At a campaign event in Ohio on August 27, 2015, Clinton compared her Republican presidential opponents to terrorists for their prolife policy views.

ROE V. WADE AND THE U.S. SUPREME COURT

DONALD TRUMP "The Supreme Court in 1973 based its decision on imagining rights and liberties in the Constitution that are nowhere to be found." Trump released a list of judges he might consider for Supreme Court vacancies, the selections were praised by groups that believe Roe v. Wade was decided **HILLARY CLINTON** At a town hall debate in New Hampshire on February 3, 2016, Clinton said every judicial appointment she would make must support abortion:

"We've got to make sure to preserve Roe v. Wade, not let it be nibbled away or repealed."

LATE-TERM ABORTIONS

DONALD TRUMP "I support the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act and urge Congress to pass this bill. A ban on elective abortions after 20 weeks will protect unborn children. We should not be one of seven countries that allows elective abortions after 20 weeks. It goes against our core values." **HILLARY CLINTON** voted against the Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act of 2003. She believes abortion should be legal up to the moment of birth. On MSNBC on September 28, 2015, Clinton said: "There can be restrictions in the very end of the third trimester, but they have to take into account the life and health of the mother."

TAXPAYER FUNDING OF ABORTIONS

DONALD TRUMP has said he would defund Planned Parenthood because they perform abortions: "Public funding of abortion providers is an insult to people of conscience at the least and an affront to good governance at best." **HILLARY CLINTON** While accepting Planned Parenthood's endorsement at a New Hampshire rally, Clinton called for repealing the Hyde Amendment. The Hyde Amendment prevents federal tax-funding of abortion and has been in place since 1976.
